Porcelain Crowns, Bridges and Onlay Instructions

Congratulations- Your tooth has just been restored with a State of the Art Porcelain Crown, Bridge or Onlay. These restorations will serve you for several years. Also, remember with proper brushing and YES flossing, will drastically increase the longevity of your new restoration!

## What you can expect

Here is some important post-operative information. If we used a local anesthetic to numb the area we treated, this numbness in your lips, teeth and tongue might last for several hours after the procedure. To avoid damage to your tongue and lips, you should avoid any chewing and hot liquid until the numbness has completely worn off.

Do not chew hard or sticky foods such as ice or other hard objects, for 24 hours from the time it was cemented as these may crack your dental restorations (or even your natural teeth!). The cement must harden during this time to provide optimum strength. Avoid chewing excessively sticky foods such as "hard tack" candy (e.g., Laffy Taffy) because it can remove restorations. It may take a few days to get used to your new crown after the final cementation.

Hot and cold sensitivity may occur for a few weeks and occasionally may last for several months. Please take Tylenol or Ibuprofen when you get home and before bedtime. If the bite does not feel comfortable, please call and make an appointment so that we may adjust it. Small pieces of excess bonding material may be found by your tongue for a couple of days. These small pieces of excess bonding material will normally come off with regular tooth brushing. If you feel anything sharp to your tongue, please call our office and the piece can be removed easily with an instrument.

Proper brushing, flossing, **flouride applications** and at the very least regular 6-month cleanings to the crown are necessary to maintain you final restoration. The one area where a crowned tooth can decay is at the bottom edge of the crown at the gum line. Small problems that develop around restorations can usually be found at an early stage and easily corrected, but postponing proper care can result in the need to replace the entire restoration.

## Warranty:

- There is a lifetime warranty on in house crowns, we will replace the restoration due to breaking at no cost to the patient. (This does not include recurrent decay from lack of hygiene or accidents that would break normal / healthy teeth).
- This warranty is null and void if the patient does not maintain their continuing care cleaning appointment schedule.
